JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 9.

AS TO THE LIST OF OFFICERS AND SOLDIERS OF THE LATE WAR.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, That the Governor, the Secretary of State, the Adjutant General, the Comptroller and the Treasurer, be authorized to cause to be published such number of copies as they may deem proper of the Record of Officers and Soldiers of the late War, now on file in the Adjutant General's Office; that they be directed to make such disposition of the same, upon such plan and in such manner as shall appear to them most judicious and consistent with the public interest.

2. RESOLVED, That the Treasurer be directed to pay upon the warrant of the Comptroller, the expense incurred in carrying the foregoing Resolution into effect.

REPORT OF THE ADJUTANT GENERAL.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY,
 ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE,
 TRENTON, July 4, 1876. }

To HIS EXCELLENCY JOSEPH D. BEDLE, GOVERNOR AND COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF:

SIR:—I have the honor to submit a special report accompanying the published Official Register of Officers and Men of New Jersey in the War of the Rebellion.

Soon after being commissioned Adjutant General of this State, in April, 1867, I was directed by Governor MARCUS L. WARD, to prepare from official sources the military record of every Soldier and Sailor credited upon the quota of this State during the late War. All necessary assistance was furnished me for the proper prosecution of this labor and it was commenced at an early day. While our State had published a very imperfect work in 1863, a large majority of the States soon after the War had issued complete and reliable records, and by a thorough examination of all these volumes a plan for this Record was adopted. During the administration of Governor THEODORE F. RANDOLPH the preparation of this roster history was continued, and a Joint Resolution was passed by the Legislature of 1871, authorizing its publication. Soon after the inauguration of Governor JOEL PARKER, a contract was made by authority of the Commissioners mentioned in the Joint Resolution to publish the volume, and after considerable delay it was commenced. It has been prosecuted only so fast as the great labor of carefully reading and re-reading the proof, and the verifying of each record would permit. Even with the greatest care the name of a soldier serving more than once during the War, may be spelled very different on different rolls, and there appears to be no way to prove it to be the same individual. I present it now as complete and accurate as it is possible to make it, by a thorough examination and compilation of the data on file in this office and in the War and Navy Departments at Washington.

A few items taken from the official reports of this office during the War period will be of interest. The first troops called into service in this State, was Company "A," National Guards, of Trenton, for special duty by order of Governor CHARLES S. OLDEN, dated April 16, 1861.

On the following day the proclamation of Governor OLDEN was issued, detaching from the Militia of the State, four regiments to serve for three months. The first company mustered in under this call was the Olden Guard, of Trenton, April 23d and within a week thereafter, the regiments were complete and were formed into a brigade, and as such were the first fully organized brigade to reach the National Capital. These regiments were called the 1st, 2d, 3d and 4th Regiments, New Jersey Militia, and afterward designated the 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th Regiments of Infantry.

The first call for troops to serve for three years or during the War was made May 3, 1861. Under this requisition the First, Second and Third Regiments, Infantry, were organized and were called the First New Jersey Brigade. Under a second call for troops, July 24, 1861, the Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Regiments Infantry, and Batteries A and B, Artillery, were raised. The Fourth Regiment and Battery A were assigned to the First Brigade, and the remainder formed the Second New Jersey Brigade.

Authority was given by the War Department, September 5th, 1861, to organize a regiment of Riflemen, and under this call the Ninth Regiment Infantry was raised and soon after sent to the field.

During the Fall of 1861, two regiments, one of Infantry and one of Cavalry were organized independent of the State authorities. On the 29th of January and February 19th, 1862 respectively, they were by direction of the War Department placed under the care of the State. The Olden Legion was designated the Tenth Regiment Infantry, and the Halsted Cavalry the First Regiment Cavalry, or the Sixteenth Regiment in the line.

In the year 1862, five other regiments were organized under a fourth call, July 7, 1862, namely: Eleventh, Twelfth, Thirteenth, Fourteenth and Fifteenth Regiments Infantry. The organized, equipped and drilled companies of militia in almost every city and town in the State furnished good material and enabled these regiments to recruit rapidly for active service.

Before the regiments raised under the last call reached the field, a call was made by the President, August 4, 1862, for eleven regiments to be drafted from the Militia of the State, to serve for nine months unless sooner discharged. A disposition to avoid a draft was manifested in all parts of the State and the entire quota under the call was filled by volunteers and placed in camp by September 3, 1862. The regiments thus raised were designated the Twenty-first, Twenty-second, Twenty-third, Twenty-fourth, Twenty-fifth, Twenty-sixth, Twenty-seventh, Twenty-eighth, Twenty-ninth, Thirtieth and Thirty-first Regiments Infantry.

Under subsequent requisitions the Second Cavalry, called the Thirty-second Regiment, and Third Cavalry, called the Thirty-sixth Regiment, with Infantry Regiments, Thirty-third, Thirty-fourth, Thirty-fifth, Thirty-seventh, Thirty-eighth, Thirty-ninth and Fortieth, and Batteries of Artillery, C, D and E, were organized and went into active service. The Forty-first Regiment of Infantry was commenced but was discontinued and consolidated with the Thirty-ninth Regiment.

The State therefore furnished during the War, thirty-seven regiments of Infantry, three regiments of Cavalry and one regiment consisting of five batteries of Artillery. At the close of the War they were returned to the State for discharge, excepting the Thirty-fourth Infantry, which was retained in service by the Government until April 30, 1866.

When the Army under General ROBERT E. LEE, invaded Pennsylvania, in June, 1863, universal alarm was created throughout the entire Northern States. An appeal for military aid was made by Governor CURTIS, of Pennsylvania, to the Governors of neighboring States June 15, 1863 and on the 17th inst., Governor PARKER called for volunteers to serve for thirty days, to aid in repelling the invasion. Under this call a full Regiment of Militia, Infantry, and one Battery of Artillery responded. The Twenty-third and Twenty-seventh Regiments Infantry, nine months troops, awaiting discharge, also volunteered for the emergency. A similar call was made by Governor PARKER July 12, 1864, when the cities of Baltimore and Washington were endangered by a threatened invasion of the enemy. The Governor issued a proclamation calling for aid from the Militia, for service in Pennsylvania, Maryland or District of Columbia, to serve for thirty days. One company responded, did the service required, returned to the State and was discharged.

It is well to note here the fact not often stated, in regard to the authority for the muster out of troops at the close of the War, at different dates and places. All these orders for discharge were under the provisions of General Orders No. 77, War Department, Adjutant General's Office, Washington, D. C., April 28, 1865, for the general reduction of the Army. The instructions of May 3, 1865, were for the muster out of men in the field; of May 4, for men in Hospitals; of May 12, for Paroled Prisoners; General Orders No. 83, War Department, Adjutant General's Office, Washington, D. C., May 8, 1865, for reducing the Cavalry arm of the service, and General Orders No. 105, War Department, Adjutant General's Office, June 2, 1865, for a reduction of Volunteer Artillery.

In the regiments raised in 1864 and 1865, and among the men forwarded in those years to older organizations, a very large number of deserters appear. This should not in any case bring discredit on these organizations. A very large proportion of these men, who were Drafted men and Substitutes, deserted in going from the State to the Rendezvous, at Alexandria, Va., or deserted there before being sent to the companies and regiments to which they had been assigned. The records of this office show the enrollment of a large number of Substitutes, and of their assignment to regiments, but their record after enrollment is unknown. The officers of these regiments knew nothing about these men, and they are not borne upon their regimental rolls.

During the War several Camps of Rendezvous for new organizations were for a time located in different parts of the State. In May, 1862, Camp Perrine, Trenton, was established. In 1863, it was converted into a general Rendezvous for the reception and forwarding of all Recruits, Drafted men and Substitutes received from the many Recruiting Agencies throughout the State.

In February, 1863, a State Agent, to reside in Washington, D. C., was appointed, with instructions to look after the interests of New Jersey, and of the troops belonging thereto, and being close to the scene of active operations, was in constant communication with the several departments of the Government, with the troops at the front, as well as those in the many Hospitals in the vicinity, and was the means of relieving the wants of the Soldiers' especially the sick and wounded. Volunteer Surgeons and Nurses were forwarded to the Army from time to time as their services were required, and Hospital and Sanitary stores transported for the use of the sick and wounded.

The reputation of New Jersey Troops was fully sustained during the entire War, being represented on all the principal battlefields. The First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, Seventeenth, Eighteenth, Nineteenth, Twentieth, Twenty-first, Twenty-second, Twenty-third, Twenty-fourth, Twenty-fifth, Twenty-sixth, Twenty-eighth, Twenty-ninth, Thirtieth, Thirty-first, Thirty-seventh, Thirty-eighth, Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Regiments Infantry, the Sixteenth (First Cavalry), Thirty-sixth (Third Cavalry) and First Regiment Artillery, served in Virginia; the Ninth Regiment Infantry served in North Carolina and Virginia; the Thirteenth, Twenty-seventh, Thirty-third, Thirty-fourth, Thirty-fifth Regiments Infantry, the Thirty-second (Second Cavalry) Regiment, served in the West and Southwest.

Under an Act of Congress awarding Medals of Honor for conspicuous bravery, quite a number of New Jersey Soldiers' were the recipients of this recognition of their service. The State by a Joint Resolution of the Legislature, March 27, 1866, also presented to all honorably discharged Soldiers and Sailors of this State, and to the widows and orphans of those who were killed or died in the service an "Honorable Testimonial."

In the preparation of this work I have received great aid at times from the Officials of the War and Navy Departments. Wherever the record of any Soldier seemed unreliable by reason of the disagreement of different vouchers, an application to these Departments made the record complete. I am under great obligations to them for prompt and reliable information.

The accurate list of burials of Soldiers of this State in National Cemeteries, has been corrected up to the present date, and to this I am greatly indebted to the courtesy of a most efficient Officer of the Government, Captain A. F. ROCKWELL, Assistant Quarter Master, United States Army, in charge of National Cemeteries. The records of the office show that two hundred and eighteen (218) Officers, and six thousand and eighty-two (6,082) enlisted Men were killed or died in the service. Total, six thousand three hundred (6,300).

I cannot close without referring to the efficient labors of my assistants in this office. From the commencement to the completion of this compilation seven persons have aided in its preparation. To two gentlemen, however, Mr. WILLIAM N. NUTT, and Mr. JAMES S. KIGER, who, in addition to the routine business of the office, and the labor of preparation and publication during this period, of a record of Jerseymen in the Revolutionary War, have worked most faithfully and successfully to make this volume complete and accurate. To them, I must accord much of the praise which, I trust, this work merits.

1861—1865.

On the 15th day of April, 1861, the Proclamation of the President of the United States was published, calling for 75,000 of the Militia of the several States, under the Act of Congress, approved February 28th, 1795, to "suppress insurrection." On the 17th day of April, a requisition from the War Department for the quota of this State was received by the Governor. His proclamation and order to detach one Regiment from each of the four Military Divisions of the State, was issued the same day, (Adjutant General's Report for 1861) The first company reported April 23d, and in seven days the four Regiments were completed.

NEW JERSEY BRIGADE---MILITIA.

The Brigade, consisting of the First, Second, Third and Fourth Regiments, was mustered into the service of the United States, at Trenton, May 1, 1861, by Major THEODORE T. S. LAIDLEY and Lieut. ALFRED T. A. TORBERT, U. S. Army. On the 3d day of May the Brigade left the State, arrived at Annapolis, Md., May 5th, and reported to the President, at Washington, D. C., the following day, being the first fully organized Brigade to arrive for the defence of the National Capital. At the battle of Bull Run, Va., July 21st, 1861, the Brigade was held as a reserve, but not engaged. On the expiration of their term of service, the Brigade returned to New Jersey, for muster out.
