INTRODUCTORY.

THE attention of the General Assembly was first officially called to the necessity for a complete and authentic "Record of Connecticut Volunteers in the War of the Rebellion" by GENERAL STEPHEN R. SMITH, in his annual report as Adjutant-General, July 1, 1885, in the following terms:

CATALOGUE OF CONNECTICUT VOLUNTEERS.

The record of service of Connecticut Volunteers in the war for the Union—a record which will never cease to be a source of patriotic pride—is one which the State should guard with jealous care. If assailed by detraction from without, it would find a sturdy defender in every citizen, from whatever source the assault might come. I deem it my duty to call attention to the fact, that the official record of that service, published in 1869, under the title "Catalogue of Connecticut Volunteers," while probably as accurate and complete as records accessible at that date rendered possible, is shown, by the fuller information now attainable, to do glaring injustice to many living veterans, as also to the memory of many who gave up their lives on the field of battle, or in the prison-pens of the South.

The entire edition of that official catalogue was some time since exhausted, and the book is now out of print. Copies of it are, however, in the hands of nearly all field officers and company commanders in Connecticut regiments now living, in all public libraries and Grand Army posts in the State, and in every adjutant-general's office in the United States, as the only authorized book of reference for information concerning the record of individual volunteers or organizations accredited to Connecticut. The frequency with which I have had occasion during the past year to note the incompleteness of that record, as relating to regimental and company organizations, and more especially its damaging inaccuracies in the records of individual volunteers, has compelled the conclusion that the State will be doing great injustice to its volunteers, and, through them, to itself, if it does not soon provide for such a revision of the Catalogue as will make it an accurate record of the service of all the soldiers and sailors who were accredited to Connecticut in the War of the Rebellion.

When an aged father, whose son is borne on the official catalogue of this State as a "deserter," presents undeniable proof that the son in question served honorably and heroically during two years in a Connecticut regiment, was then captured by the enemy while lying helpless from disease in a field-hospital at Cold Harbor, and died in a Southern prison-pen, aid is most gladly given in securing an amendment of the son's record at the Headquarters of the Army in Washington; but this office is powerless to correct the record in the many copies extant of the official catalogue of 1869. The manuscript records of this office are, however, always corrected, in cases where a change of record has been made and the fact communicated to this office by the War Department of the United States, or the persons interested.

The catalogue is also defective in that it contains no record of enlistments or service of Connecticut Volunteers in the Navy or in the Regular Army during the war, or of service in the Invalid Corps after their transfer thereto.

An interesting feature of a revision would be the addition of the record of service of citizens of our Commonwealth in the War of the Revolution, the War with Great Britain in 1812, and the Mexican War, which would complete the war history of the State. Frequent calls are made upon this office for information as to the service of men in the before-mentioned wars, which is required in the settlement of claims against the General Government, but, not being in possession of the records, this office is unable to assist applicants by giving the required information, which should be available from the records. This office being the military headquarters of the State, claimants naturally expect that information of this character will be readily furnished from its records.

I respectfully submit that the subject of revision and amendment of the Catalogue of Connecticut Volunteers is worthy of careful consideration.

The matter was duly referred to the Committee on Military Affairs, and as a result the following Act was unanimously adopted by the General Assembly:

PROVIDING FOR A RECORD OF CONNECTICUT VOLUNTEERS.

Resolved by this Assembly: That the Adjutant-General of this State be, and he is hereby, directed to prepare the manuscript for, and cause to be published, at an expense not to exceed fifteen thousand dollars, two thousand copies of a catalogue or roll of members of the regiments, battalions, and batteries which were in the service of the United States from this State during the period of the late rebellion, and of those who, during said period, served in the navy or marine corps of the United States from this State, and were credited on its quota, with the residence at enrollment or enlistment, and complete military or naval record of each of such soldiers, sailors, or marines. He shall also include in said catalogue the names and records of those soldiers who served in Connecticut organizations, and sailors and marines who enlisted in the navy from this State during the War of the Revolution, the War with Great Britain in 1812, and the Mexican War.

He shall also prepare and insert in its proper place in said catalogue a brief general summary or history of the operations and service of each of such regiments, battalions, and batteries, and shall also insert therein the name, residence, and record of service of those persons who were residents of this State, and who were in the service of the United States during the late rebellion, in military organizations from other States, upon receiving proper evidence of such service.

One copy of such catalogue shall be forwarded to each State officer, and each officer and member of the present General Assembly; one copy to each town clerk and judge of probate in this State, to be kept in their respective offices and handed over to their successors in office; one copy to the Adjutant-General of the United States, and to the Adjutant-General of each State of the United States; one copy to the Adjutant-General of the Grand Army of the Republic in this State, and to each Post of the Grand Army of the Republic and Camp of the Sons of Veterans in this State; two copies each to the Librarian of the United States, and to the State Library of this State; one copy to each college and circulating library in this State open to the public. Two hundred copies shall be retained in the Adjutant-General's office of this State for such future use or distribution as may be authorized or rendered necessary under the provisions of this resolution, and the balance shall be kept in the office of the Adjutant-General of this State, and furnished to such persons as may desire them, at five dollars per copy.

The sum of fifteen thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the payment, under direction of the Adjutant-General, of all bills and expenses that may be incurred in carrying out the provisions of this resolution.

Approved, March 10, 1886.

In accordance with this legislative provision, work was at once begun and steps were taken to secure access to the records of the Adjutant-General's office at Washington, as the only means of rendering complete a large number of individual records which, by reason of transfer of the soldiers to the Regular Army, the Navy, or the Veteran Reserve Corps, and also by reason of the many amendments of individual records since final muster-out, were left incomplete or incorrect on the original muster-out rolls in possession of the State.

All applications by State officials for such access to Washington records had previously and uniformly been denied by the Adjutant-General of the Army, for reasons which seemed to him imperative, and the strongest appeal which could be made in this instance failed to secure his assent. General Drum, however, finally consented to refer the matter to the Honorable Secretary of War, and to that official Governor Harrison addressed the following appeal:

To the Honorable WILLIAM C. ENDICOTT,

SECRETARY OF WAR, WASHINGTON, D. C.:

SIR, — The State of Connecticut, by the unanimous action of both branches of its last Legislature, made it the duty of its Adjutant-General to secure for the records of his office and to prepare for publication in official form, the complete record of all volunteer soldiers and sailors from the State who served in the War of the Revolution, the War of 1812, the Mexican War, and the War of the Rebellion.

The unanimity of this action was largely due to the fact that up to this time the State had taken no proper steps for the completion of such records; has in fact at different times surrendered to the General Government nearly all muster-rolls and records of service in the earlier wars, and by inaction in the matter during the last twenty years has been steadily drifting toward similar paucity of record concerning the service of its citizens in the late War of the Rebellion. The efforts of the Adjutant-General to perform the duty thus imposed have met with prompt favor and co-operation at the hands of all the custodians of Old War Records in the Navy Department, and in the Department of Audit, and of Pensions, and transcripts of all the rolls of State troops in the old wars, and in the Navy in the late war, are now in course of preparation in those Departments, in compliance with his request.

I am informed by him that his application to General Drum for facilities necessary to complete the State record of

Connecticut Soldiers in the late war has not yet been granted, and that the matter is soon to be referred by General Drum to yourself for final decision.

I am deeply impressed by a sense of the real importance of this matter to the State, as it involves the very integrity of the State itself in relation to that class of its citizens to whom it owes as much as it ever can to any.

The State of Connecticut has, in the best of good faith, passed many acts of favor and benefit to its loyal veterans now living, and to their widows and orphans.

It has exempted all honorably discharged veterans of the late war from taxation on property to the amount of one thousand dollars, and from the military commutation tax.

Its courts and town authorities are charged with conferment of the franchise upon foreign-born residents who served honorably in the war of the Union without regard to conditions otherwise precedent to naturalization.

It has assumed the care and support of all indigent and disabled honorably discharged veterans, who are at present, from any cause, in need of surgical or medical treatment, or a home.

It guarantees a monthly stipend, which is in fact a State pension, to all orphan children of honorably discharged veterans who are under fourteen years of age, provided the death of the father was caused by wounds or disease contracted in the service.

It pays the burial expenses and erects a head-stone to every honorably discharged veteran who dies unpossessed of means sufficient for the purpose, and strictly forbids the burial of such honorably discharged veteran of the war in any pauper burial ground.

These acts of the Legislature make it the imperative duty of the State not only to know who are its rightful beneficiaries, but to render that information accessible to its courts of record and to its town authorities.

I therefore ask with confidence that you will favorably consider the application formally made by General Smith to General Drum, believing that the favorable conditions under which the application is made in behalf of Connecticut are such as to fully justify a broad exception in favor of this State.

The favorable conditions briefly stated as I understand them, are as follows:

The records of Connecticut volunteers in General Drum's custody are completely written up in volumes handy for reference, so that no handling of original muster-rolls, or reference to them, would be required.

The records furnished by this State for verification and completion at the Adjutant-General's office will be in equally compact form and complete, so far as possible, from the State rolls, with the small percentage of individual records which are incomplete, and concerning which further information is desired, plainly indicated, thereby reducing to a minimum the work of completion.

The State will only ask access to the records at the Adjutant-General's office at such times as they are not needed for other reference, and thus will not in any degree obstruct the regular routine work of the office.

The State will gladly pay, if required to do so, the salary of any competent clerk who may be detailed for the work, or will provide an expert, subject to whatever conditions General Drum may impose.

Confident that you will fairly appreciate the reasonableness of this request, I have the honor to be,

This appeal was forcibly seconded by Senators Platt and Hawley, General Hawley going in person to the Secretary of War with General Smith, and, as a result, it was finally agreed that the information desired as to individual records should be afforded Connecticut by the Adjutant-General's Office, but that a formal call must be made in case of each soldier's record desired, and that the work of collating the information should be performed by clerks detailed for the purpose, and working extra time, for which service they should be paid by the State.

This important concession from the War Department was at once availed of, as affording the only feasible plan for prosecuting the work. The necessity of paying for the clerical labor in the Department at Washington was an unexpected addition to the cost of the undertaking, but this was more than compensated for by rendering it possible to accomplish in a few months what would have taken as many years if left to the ordinary routine methods of the Department in regular hours.

Such progress was made with the work that the General Assembly of 1887 further provided for it by the passage of the following Act:

Resolved by this Assembly: SECTION 1. That the Adjutant-General, in carrying out the provisions of Senate Joint Resolution Number Twenty-five, approved March 10, 1886, be and he is hereby, directed to publish two thousand and five hundred copies of a catalogue or roll of members of regiments, batteries, and battalions which were in the service of the United States from this State during the period of the late rebellion, and of those who, during said period, served in the navy or marine corps of the United States from this State and were credited upon its quota, and of those persons who were residents of this State and who were in the service of the United States during the late rebellion, in military organizations from other States, upon receiving proper evidence of such service, with the residence at time of enrollment or enlistment, and complete military or naval record of each of such soldiers, sailors, and marines, and fifteen hundred copies of a catalogue or roll containing the names and records of those soldiers who served in Connecticut organizations, and sailors and marines who enlisted in the Navy from this State during the War of the Revolution, the War of 1812 with Great Britain, and the Mexican War. Said catalogue of those who served during the War of the Rebellion shall be distributed by said Adjutant-General to the officers, persons, and organizations named in said resolution of 1886, and in addition thereto one volume to each State officer and each officer and member of the present General Assembly. Said catalogue of those who served in the War of the Revolution, the War of 1812 with Great Britain, and the Mexican War, shall be distributed by the Adjutant-General as follows: One copy to each State officer, and each officer and member of the present General Assembly; one copy to each town clerk and judge of probate in this State, to be kept in their respective offices and handed over to their successors in office; one copy to the Adjutant-General of the United States, and to the Adjutant-General of each State of the United States; two copies each to the librarian of the United States, and to the State library of this State, and one copy to each college and to each circulating library in this State open to the public. Two hundred copies of the first-named volume, and one hundred copies of the second-named volume, shall be retained in the Adjutant-General's office of this State for such future use or distribution as may be authorized or rendered necessary under the provisions of this resolution, and the balance shall be kept in the office of the Adjutant-General of this State, and furnished to such persons as may desire them, at five dollars per copy, and the proceeds from the sale of said books shall be returned to the State treasury.

SEC. 2. All parts of said resolution of 1886, hereinbefore referred to, inconsistent with this resolution, are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the payment, under the direction of the Adjutant-General, of all bills and expenses that may be incurred in carrying out the provisions of this resolution and in completing and publishing the catalogue referred to herein.

Approved, April 13, 1887.

Under this Act the work was continued with vigor, and was essentially completed in December, 1888.

METHOD OF COMPILATION.

From the beginning of the work, in 1886, it has been determined, at whatever cost of labor or research, to make each soldier's record absolutely complete, if material was anywhere in existence to render this possible. To this end, each of the forty-five hundred original muster-rolls in possession of the State was at the outset critically examined, and all the information therein contained carefully collated. It was then found that from various causes more than ten thousand individual records, as disclosed by the muster-rolls, were incomplete or contradictory, and would need to be sought at various Departments in Washington. For each of these incomplete records a separate call was made upon the Adjutant-General of the Army or the Bureau of Equipment and Recruiting of the Navy Department at Washington, and at times as many as thirty regular department clerks have been thus employed three hours per day over-time in the research. It has been no unusual thing for a single call to necessitate a search through the various divisions of the Department of the Adjutant-General, the Surgeon-General, the Second, Third, and Fourth Auditor, and the Navy Department, before the individual record to which it pertained could be rendered complete. This thorough and systematic search of individual records would have been simply impossible but for the special concessions secured from the War Department at the outset, and it is believed that the result, as attained in this volume, fully justifies the labor and expense.

HISTORIES OF ORGANIZATIONS.

The histories accompanying the rosters in this volume were prepared at the request of the Adjutant-General, by members of the several organizations, and they are given as written, without further revision than a verification of dates by comparison with official records.

CONNECTICUT MEN IN REGIMENTS OF OTHER STATES.

The records of Connecticut men who served in regiments of other States have been collected with great difficulty, and the list cannot be considered complete. Repeated efforts have been made, by circulars published in all the papers of the State and furnished to all Posts of the Grand Army, to obtain the names of *all* Connecticut men who so served, and every name so secured has been subjected to examination in Washington, and the authentic record secured and placed in this volume. If names are omitted it is solely because the parties interested, or their relatives or friends, have failed to respond to the request for their names.

CONNECTICUT MEN IN THE REGULAR ARMY.

The records of Connecticut men in the Regular Army have been secured direct from the War Department, and can be relied upon as complete, as also the records of Connecticut men commissioned directly by the President to positions in the Volunteer Service.

CONNECTICUT MEN IN THE NAVY.

The records of Connecticut officers and men in the Navy were procured by an exhaustive search of the books in the Bureau of Equipment and Recruiting of the Navy Department at Washington. Only very incomplete records of such enlistments were kept in the State, and as no muster-rolls or reports pertaining to Naval service were rendered to the State during the war, an expensive and laborious search through hundreds of manuscript volumes in the Navy Department was the best and only means whereby the records in any form could be procured. This search was conducted in the most thorough manner possible, under the immediate supervision of MR. WM. F. STIDHAM, who, by reason of long and faithful service in the Department, was peculiarly fitted for the work. While the individual Naval records given are as full and complete as the official records themselves, there are yet features omitted which would have given additional interest and value to the work could they have been procured. In the Descriptive Lists of the Naval Records in the Navy Department the birth-place of the recruit is given, but no mention is made of the place of residence at date of enlistment. There was, therefore, no practicable method of obtaining from the Naval records the names of Connecticut men, born elsewhere, but enlisting from Connecticut, nor of excluding from the list the names of men born in Connecticut, but enlisting from other States. The only practicable plan was found to be, in the case of enlisted men, to give the records of all who were borne on the Navy Department books as born in Connecticut, and in the case of commissioned officers, those who were "appointed from" Connecticut.

The principal defects of the Naval record in this work are, therefore, 1st, the omission of the residence of the recruit at date of enlistment; 2d, the omission of names and records of some recruits born without the State, but citizens of Connecticut at date of enlistment. These defects have been unavoidable for the reasons stated; and if in the future the list is to be made more complete by the addition of other names, it can only be done on information furnished the Adjutant-General of the State, giving names, with date and place of enlistment, of the citizens rendering service. The complete and authentic record can then be obtained from Washington, as have been the more than twenty-five hundred Naval records here given.

CONNECTICUT MEN IN THE MARINE CORPS.

An earnest effort has been made to secure the records of Connecticut men who served in the Marine Corps, but with unsatisfactory results. The officials in charge of records at Marine Barracks in Washington insisted upon such exorbitant compensation for the clerical work necessary that on receipt of the first installment of the copied records it was not deemed advisable to prosecute the work further.

With this exception the Departments at Washington have granted every facility for the prosecution of the widely-extended search of records necessary to the completion of this work.

Acknowledgments are especially due to the Honorable WILLIAM C. ENDICOTT, Secretary of War; Brig.-Gen. R. C. DRUM, Adjutant-General, U. S. A.; Commodore W. S. SCHLEY, Chief of Bureau of Equipment and Recruiting, U. S. Navy; and Gen. JOHN C. BLACK, Commissioner of Pensions; without whose continuous co-operation and assistance during the two and one-half years covered by the work, a very large number of the individual records here given in full would necessarily have been incomplete or entirely omitted.

The large amount of clerical work required in the Departments at Washington has called for an expenditure of \$15,571.20. This has been largely in excess of the original estimate for that work, for the reason that a large proportion of the individual records which were supposed to be complete in the Catalogue of 1869 were found to be inaccurate, and also because many of the records required search in other divisions than that of the Adjutant-General of the Army. This search has involved the forwarding to Washington of 11,561 calls for individual records, all of which after investigation have been returned with the information desired, not one having been lost or mislaid. For the admirable systemization of the work which rendered this result possible great credit is due to Major E. K. Winship, of the Surgeon-General's Office in Washington, to whom, at the suggestion of Senator Joseph R. Hawley, was intrusted a general supervision of the clerical work in the Departments there.

ADDITIONAL RECORDS OF WOUNDS.

All who are familiar with original muster-roll records will realize the impossibility of compiling from service-rolls a complete list of casualties occurring in any organization in the volunteer service. It was often the case that soldiers received permanently disabling wounds without the fact appearing in any muster-roll of their company, or any official record being made of them. To supply this omission so far as possible, a careful and exhaustive search was made of the records of the Pension Office in Washington, with the result of securing a list of over four hundred records of wounds which could have been procured from no other source. These records are given in a separate list in this volume.

OVERLAPPING COMMISSIONS.

An instance will occasionally be found in these records where two commissioned officers of the same grade appear to simultaneously hold the same commission. This apparent inconsistency of the record is accounted for by the fact that, upon application by the parties interested, numerous amendments of officers' records have been authorized by the Adjutant-General U. S. A., since the close of the war, and in some cases, a re-muster so procured has covered a portion of time also covered by a prior or subsequent commission held by another officer. In cases of this nature the Adjutant-General's office at Washington, while sustaining the validity of the re-muster, would not construe it to the disadvantage of the officer holding under the prior muster.

It is earnestly hoped that the efforts which have been made to render this record one of real and permanent value to the State may prove to have been so directed as to meet with general approbation.

HISTORY

OF THE

FIRST CONNECTICUT VOLUNTEERS.

(Three Months.)

WRITTEN BY COL. GEORGE S. BURNHAM.

THE First Regiment of the three months' men was recruited under the proclamation of President Lincoln, issued Monday, April 15, 1861, and the call of Governor Buckingham issued the day following.

Anticipating the call of the Governor, recruiting had begun so promptly that by the 16th many companies were ready to report with more than the minimum required, and Rifle Company A of Hartford, with George S. Burnham, Captain, Joseph R. Hawley, 1st Lieutenant, Albert W. Drake, 2d Lieutenant, had completed its organization with full ranks. This company and Rifle Company A, Captain John C. Comstock, left Hartford for the rendezvous at New Haven, April 20th. The regiment was at once organized with Dan. Tyler of Norwich, as Colonel, George S. Burnham, Lieut.-Colonel, and John L. Chatfield, Major.

The regiment was at first quartered in the buildings of Yale College and wherever shelter could be found, but soon went into camp in a vacant lot in the western part of the town, where the different companies were mustered into United States service, and immediately began work in earnest at company and regimental drill. On May 10th the regiment embarked for Washington on the steamer "Bienville," and on the same day Colonel Tyler, who was a West Point graduate and had seen regular army service, was made Brigadier-General of Volunteers; Lieut.-Colonel Burnham being promoted to the full Colonelcy of the regiment.

The First arrived at Washington *via* Chesapeake Bay and the Potomac May 13th and proceeded at once to camp at "Glenwood," about two miles north of the Capitol.

May 31st Lieut.-Colonel Chatfield was promoted to the Colonelcy of the Third Regiment, *vice* Arnold resigned.

Major Spiedel was made Lieut.-Colonel and Captain Theodore Byxbee of Meriden, was made Major.

These were days of intense excitement in Washington, and false alarms were frequent, but cool heads were in control of the Connecticut Brigade.

On the day of Colonel Ellsworth's funeral, all Washington was subjected to a false alarm, the long roll was sounded, and the First was hastily ordered out and

marched to Long Bridge, when the alarm having subsided it was ordered back to camp.

At midnight, June 1st, the regiment broke camp at Glenwood and crossing Long Bridge, marched to Roach's Mills on the Alexandria & Leesburg railroad, where it established camp, relieving the 12th New York.

About June 16th a detachment of the First, under Colonel Burnham, was ordered up the railroad as escort to General Tyler in a reconnoissance. The train was made up of miserable rolling stock, and the couplings parted so frequently that the detachment was compelled to return after passing a short distance beyond Vienna. As the train was passing Vienna on its return, it was fired into from an ambuscade, and George H. Bugbee, of Infantry Company A, was severely wounded. If we except Major Theodore Winthrop, who fell at Big Bethel seven days earlier, this was the first blood of a Connecticut soldier in the Civil war.

The next day the First was ordered on the same duty, but was relieved by the 1st and 2d Ohio regiments, the 1st Connecticut going to the grounds in the vicinity of Long Bridge, where with a large number of other regiments it was reviewed by the Hon. Simon Cameron, Secretary of War.

As the review closed the First was ordered hurriedly to the relief of the Ohio regiments which had been fired into at Vienna. On the next day the First went into camp at Falls Church, then considerably in advance of the main lines — a position peculiarly exposed to attack, as the rebels could easily reach its rear by way of either Balls' or Bailey's Cross Roads.

The First Regiment was joined by the Second on the next day, and soon after by the Third Connecticut and the Second Maine regiments, all of which were organized as a brigade, under command of Colonel Erasmus D. Keyes.

On July 16th the entire army under immediate command of General McDowell began its advance toward Manassas, and Keyes Brigade, designated the 1st Brigade, 1st Division, had the advance — the First Regiment covering the left of the head of column as skirmishers and the Second covering the right. They bivouacked the first

night at Vienna, and the second at Germantown, arriving at Centerville on the 18th.

At midnight of Saturday, July 20th, the brigade was advanced *via* Warrentown road toward Bull Run, and was detached to guard the Warrentown road during the detour of the flanking column *via* Sudley Ford. It remained in this position until about 10 A. M., when it was advanced across Bull Run and formed line of battle beyond Youngs Branch, farther west.

Colonel Keyes in his official report said :

“The order to advance was given at about ten o'clock A. M., and from that hour to four P. M. my brigade was in constant activity on the field of battle. The First Regiment Connecticut Volunteers was met by a body of cavalry and infantry, which it repelled, and at several other encounters at different parts of the line the enemy constantly retired before us.

“Before recrossing Bull Run, and until my brigade mingled with the retreating mass, it maintained perfect freedom from panic, and at the moment I received the order for retreat, and for some time afterward, it was in as good order as in the morning on the road. Half an hour earlier I supposed the victory to be ours.”

Before night-fall the entire brigade reached its former campground at Centerville in good order, and under orders, bivouacked as was supposed for the night; the men suffering much from fatigue, at once going to sleep on their arms.

About 10 o'clock P. M. peremptory orders came to continue the retreat to Falls Church. The road was now comparatively clear, as the disorganized part of the army was already far advanced on its way to Washington. About 9 A. M. the next day the regiment arrived at Falls Church, and, in a drenching rain, struck its tents and despatched its entire camp and garrison equipage, together with that of the Second Maine, which had left the brigade, to Alexandria. The three Connecticut regiments marched that night to the camp of the First and Second Ohio regiments, which they found deserted. Occupying this standing camp during the night, it spent all day Tuesday, July

23d, in packing and sending to Alexandria the camp and garrison equipage of the First and Second Ohio and the Second New York regiments, leaving not a vestige of anything useful to fall into the hands of the enemy.

General Tyler in his report says :

“At seven o'clock on Tuesday evening, I saw the three Connecticut regiments, with two thousand bayonets, march under the guns of Fort Corcoran in good order, after having saved us not only a large amount of public property, but the mortification of seeing our standing camps fall into the hands of the enemy.”

The First remained in Washington until July 27th, when (their term of service having expired on the 22d) it started for New Haven, where, after tedious delays, it arrived and was mustered out on July 31st. The regiment was splendidly armed and equipped; eight companies with Springfield rifled muskets, and the two flank companies with Sharps rifles. The clothing was much of it very inferior, though all possible effort was made to remedy the defect.

A few of the companies were old militia organizations which preferred to retain their old regimental letters, thereby occasioning some confusion, but the exigencies of that short term of service did not warrant dallying with trifles.

Too much credit can never be accorded the members of the three months' regiments, who from pure patriotism, without promise or hope of bounty or reward, eagerly enlisted to repel the enemies of their country; and who with still greater alacrity would have enlisted for the war had the call of President Lincoln permitted it.

This early service was an excellent school for the citizen soldiers of the State, and by far the larger part of those who participated were soon again in the service for three years or the war, fully one hundred and eighty from the 1st Regiment holding commissions.

Connecticut can always look back with pride on her three months' volunteers of 1861.

HISTORY

OF THE

SECOND CONNECTICUT VOLUNTEERS.

WRITTEN BY GEN. JAMES B. COIT, PRIVATE IN CO. B.

THE Second Regiment of Connecticut three months Infantry Volunteers, Col. Alfred H. Terry, was raised under President Lincoln's first call for troops, and its numerical strength was 798 men.

Company A, "Buckingham Rifles," Captain Chester, was intended for assignment to the First Regiment, having been recruited at the Governor's home by Private James B. Coit, the first volunteer in Norwich, on the receipt of the telegram announcing the assault on Fort Sumter.

The "Mansfield Guards" of Middletown, Captain Dickinson, the New Haven "Grays," Captain Osborn, and the National Guard of Birmingham, Captain Russell, were old, well drilled, and popular militia organizations; the other companies were wholly enlisted under the President's call. The Second Regiment was fortunate in its officers, most of them being trained soldiers of the State Militia, Colonel Terry having served as colonel, Lieut.-Colonel Young as brigadier-general, Major Colburn as major, Adjutant Russell as adjutant, and many of its captains and lieutenants as line officers.

Eight companies were armed with Sharps' rifles and two with Springfield muskets. The regiment was mustered into the United States service at Brewster's Park, New Haven, May 7, 1861.

It embarked May 10th on the steamer *Cahawba* for Washington, D. C., reaching its destination May 14th, and camping at Meridian Hill, where it remained and made the most of its school for war until ordered into Virginia.

On the night of the 16th of June it crossed "Long Bridge," aiming to camp at Roach's Mills, about nine miles from Washington, but after reaching its destination, on the 17th, it was ordered to the support of Colonel McCook's Ohio regiment (Schenck's Brigade), which had that day been attacked at Vienna Station.

The enemy having retreated before its arrival, the Second Regiment continued its march to Taylor's Tavern on Oak Hill, near Falls Church, some five miles from Roach's Mills, forming here, with the other Connecticut three months' men, a camp of instruction, where, adding picket

and other outpost duty to its former routine work, it remained till the advance on Bull Run.

At this camp it was brigaded with the First and Third Connecticut, the Eighth New York, the Second Maine, all infantry; and with Tompkins' New York Cavalry, and Berrian's New York Battery, Brig.-Gen. Daniel Tyler commanding.

Subsequently, General Tyler was assigned to a division of troops, and with Gen. E. D. Keyes in command of the brigade the Second Connecticut took part in the battle of Bull Run, July 21st, acquitting itself with great credit, maintaining its regimental formations throughout the action, and demonstrating by its coolness under fire the excellence of its material and the thoroughness of its discipline. Its losses were one killed and fifteen taken prisoners and missing.

In the latter part of the afternoon, under instructions, it fell back in good order on Centreville Heights, and later continued its march to the camp at Oak Hill, where it arrived on the following morning. For parts of two days the regiment was here employed in striking its tents and the tents of several brigades of troops left standing and deserted by former occupants.

Large quantities of arms, ammunition, camp equipage, and a miscellaneous variety of stores and other property, to the value of many thousands of dollars, here awaited the favorable response of the Quartermaster-General's Department for transportation and the action of the Connecticut troops for safety. Telegrams to headquarters brought the necessary trains, and the men of the Connecticut regiments loaded, guarded, and escorted them over the Potomac.

At the expiration of its term of service the Second Regiment returned to New Haven, where, on the 7th day of August, 1861, its men were mustered out, some to close their military career, but most of them to make use of their experience, training, and discipline in the three years' regiments of the State, wherein a large number became valuable officers, not a few won spurs, and others stars for gallant and meritorious service.
